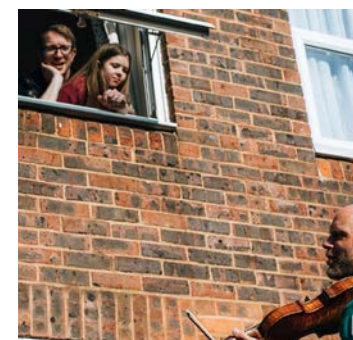
Gummy Tape Puppetry Workshop
